In Coffs Harbour, Council is cracking down on illegal dumping. Please be aware that it is illegal to put any waste items or unwanted household goods out on the footpath or roadside, unless you have contacted Council and booked a bulky household goods waste collection. Fines from \$2,000 apply.

If you've got bulky waste items to get rid of, don't risk a \$2,000 illegal dumping fine. Residents can also get two vouchers per year for disposal of waste, or you can book a kerbside bulky waste collection for \$44.
